

Aim of the Document

This report has been primarily provided to inform the National Referral Mechanism Oversight Board of the UK's delivery against a number of definitive requirements contained in the Council of Europe Convention against Trafficking in Human Beings.

It is important to note that the number of referrals outlined in this report is not a measure of human trafficking in the UK, rather it indicates the number of individuals who have been referred as potential victims of human trafficking.

Report Base

The information in this report is obtained from referrals made to the National Referral Mechanism (NRM) for the three month period from 01/04/2012 to 30/06/2012. The data used is correct as at 01/10/2012. It should be noted that the data used is a 'snapshot in time' and there are decisions on trafficking status yet to be made.

The data cut-off date for this report is 01/10/2012.

Key Points

- During the three month period 01/04/2012 to 30/06/2012 there were 292 referrals¹ to the NRM, comprising individuals from 51 countries of origin; most commonly Nigeria, Albania, Vietnam, Romania and Poland.
- As at 01/10/2012, 82 (28%) of the 292 people referred to the NRM received a
 'positive conclusive' decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The
 most common countries of origin for people who received a positive conclusive
 decision were Poland, UK, Romania, Hungary, Lithuania, Nigeria and Slovakia.
- 47 (16%) of the 292 people referred to the NRM were still awaiting a 'reasonable grounds' decision. 73 (25%) of the 292 people referred to the NRM were still awaiting a conclusive decision.
- The most common exploitation type for adults who were referred was sexual exploitation. However the most common exploitation types for adults who received a positive conclusive decision, and were therefore found to have been trafficked, was labour exploitation.
- The most common exploitation types for minors who were referred were labour exploitation and domestic servitude. Labour exploitation was the most common exploitation type for those who received a positive conclusive decision, and were therefore found to have been trafficked.
- Four people were referred from Northern Ireland, 22 from Scotland and 15 from Wales.

National Referral Mechanism Statistics - April to June 2012

TEXT

- 1. On 01/04/2009 the UK adopted a National Referral Mechanism (NRM), which is a process to identify individuals who may be potential victims of trafficking (PVoT) and provide them with the protection and support to which they are entitled under the Council of Europe Convention on Action against Trafficking in Human Beings.
- 2. The process starts when a designated 'first responder' refers a person believed to be a potential victim of trafficking to one of two separate, but linked, UK Competent Authorities: the UK Border Agency and UK Human Trafficking Centre. The process has two stages, 'Reasonable Grounds' and 'Conclusive Decision', during which trained staff assess all available information in reaching a decision as to whether or not the individual is a victim of human trafficking.
- 3. This report contains data derived wholly from information supplied by the NRM. The data only reflects potential victims of trafficking referred into the NRM and cannot be taken as a definitive situation report on human trafficking into, within and out of the UK. Potential victims of trafficking may not be referred into the NRM for a number of reasons and therefore would not feature within this report.
- 4. Details for referrals from first responders for the UK are contained in tables after each summary of adult and minor referrals in the main text. Details for referrals from first responders in Northern Ireland are contained in Annex D and the four referrals represent one percent of the UK total referrals. Details for referrals from first responders in Scotland are contained in Annex E and the 22 referrals represent eight percent of the UK total referrals. Details for referrals from first responders in Wales are contained in Annex F and the 15 referrals represent five percent of the UK total referrals.

² The NRM Oversight Board has a prescribed list of organisations that may act as first responder and can refer individuals to the NRM. This list currently contains police officers, SOCA, UK Border Agency, Social Services and a number of non-government organisations (NGOs).

³ The Competent Authorities have a target date of five working days from receipt of referral in which to make a decision. The test that is applied is whether the statement 'I suspect but cannot prove...' would be true and whether a reasonable person would be of the opinion that, having regard to the information available, there were reasonable grounds to believe the individual concerned had been trafficked.

⁴ The Competent Authorities have a target date of 45 calendar days from the Reasonable Grounds decision to make a Conclusive Decision on the individual's victim status having gathered further information. The test that is applied is whether on the balance of probabilities 'It is more likely than not...' that the individual was trafficked based on the information available.

Breakdown of all (Adult and Minor)⁵ Referrals by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

- 5. During the three month period 01/04/2012 to 30/06/2012, there were 292 referrals of adults and minors to the NRM. These referrals comprise individuals from 51 countries of origin. The table below shows the 10 most frequently referred countries of origin, which account for 199 (68%) of all referrals⁶.
- 6. As at 01/10/2012, the most common countries of origin for people referred were Nigeria 52 (18%), Albania 28 (10%), Vietnam 27 (9%), Romania 22 (8%) and Poland 19 (7%).
- 7. The most common countries of origin for people who received a positive reasonable grounds decision, and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process, were Nigeria (24), Poland (19), Vietnam (18), Albania (14) and Romania (11).
- 8. 82 (28%) of the 292 people referred to the NRM received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for people who received a positive conclusive decision were Poland (18), UK (9), Romania (8), Hungary (8), Lithuania (7), Nigeria (7) and Slovakia (7).
- 9. 47 (16%) of the 292 people referred to the NRM had not received a reasonable grounds decision. The most common countries of origin for people who had not received a reasonable grounds decision were Nigeria (12), Albania (5), China (4), Vietnam (4) and Somalia (3).
- 10. 73 (25%) of the 292 people referred to the NRM had not received a conclusive decision. The most common countries of origin for people who had not received a conclusive decision were Nigeria (14), Vietnam (12), Albania (11), Bangladesh (3), China (3) and Eritrea (3) and Gambia (3).

Breakdown of Adults by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

- 11. There were 207 adult referrals, comprising individuals from 40 countries of origin. This table below shows the 10 most referred countries of origin, which account for 148 (71%) of all adult referrals⁷.
- 12. The most common countries of origin for adults referred were Nigeria 38 (18%), Albania 23 (11%), Romania 20 (10%), Poland 19 (9%) and China 10 (5%).
- 13. 125 (60%) of the 207 adult referrals received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process. The most common countries of origin were Poland 19, Nigeria 15, Albania 12, Romania 9, Hungary 8 and UK 8.
- 14. 73 (35%) of the 207 adult referrals received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for adults who obtained a positive conclusive decision were Poland 18, Hungary 8, UK 8, Lithuania 7, Romania 7 and Slovakia 7.

Breakdown of Adult Referrals by Exploitation Type and Gender, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

- 15. The most common exploitation types for the 207 adults who were referred were sexual exploitation 88 (43%), labour exploitation 77 (37%) and domestic servitude 26 (13%). The exploitation type was unknown in 16 cases (8%).
- 16. Of the 207 adults referred, 142 (69%) were female and 65 (31%) were male.
- 17. The most common exploitation types for the 125 adults who received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process were labour exploitation 57 (46%), sexual exploitation 53 (42%) and domestic servitude 11 (9%).
- 18. The most common exploitation types for the 73 adults who received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked were labour exploitation 44 (60%), sexual exploitation 25 (34%) and domestic servitude 2 (3%).

Breakdown of Adult Referrals by Age Range, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

19. Of the 207 adults referred, the largest age group represented were 21-30 year olds who comprise 99 (48%) of those referred. This age group was also the most prevalent for people who received a positive conclusive decision (40 adults, 55%).

Breakdown of Minors by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

- 20. 85 minors were referred to the NRM, comprising individuals from 25 countries of origin. The table below shows the 10 most frequently referred countries of origin, which account for 63 (74%) of all child referrals⁹.
- 21. The most common countries of origin for minors referred were Vietnam 20 (24%), Nigeria 14 (16%), China 8 (9%), Albania 5 (6%) and Bangladesh 4 (5%).
- 22. 50 (59%) of the 85 minors referred received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process. The most common countries of origin were Vietnam 15 (30%), Nigeria 9 (18%), Bangladesh 3 (6%), China 3 (6%) and Guinea 3 (6%).
- 23. 9 (11%) of the 85 minors referred to the NRM received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for minors who obtained a positive conclusive decision were Vietnam 4, Bulgaria 1, Guinea 1, Nigeria 1, Romania 1 and the UK 1.

Breakdown of Minor Referrals by Exploitation Type and Gender, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

- The most common exploitation types for the 85 minors referred to the NRM were labour exploitation 21 (25%), domestic servitude 20 (24%) and sexual exploitation 12 (14%). The exploitation type was unknown in 32 cases (38%). Of these, 43 (51%) were females and 42 (49%) were males.
- The most common exploitation types for the 50 minors who received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process were domestic servitude 14 (28%), labour exploitation 14 (28%) and sexual exploitation 8 $(16\%)^{10}$.
- The most common exploitation type for the 9 minors who received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked were labour exploitation 6 (67%) and domestic servitude 2 (22%)¹¹.

Breakdown of Minor Referrals by Exploitation Type and Age Range, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

27. The age range of 16-17 years old was the most common for minors at the time of referral and comprised of 42 (49%) of all minors referred. The age range of 16-17 years was the most common for minors granted a positive conclusive decision and comprised of 6 (67%) minors at this stage.
