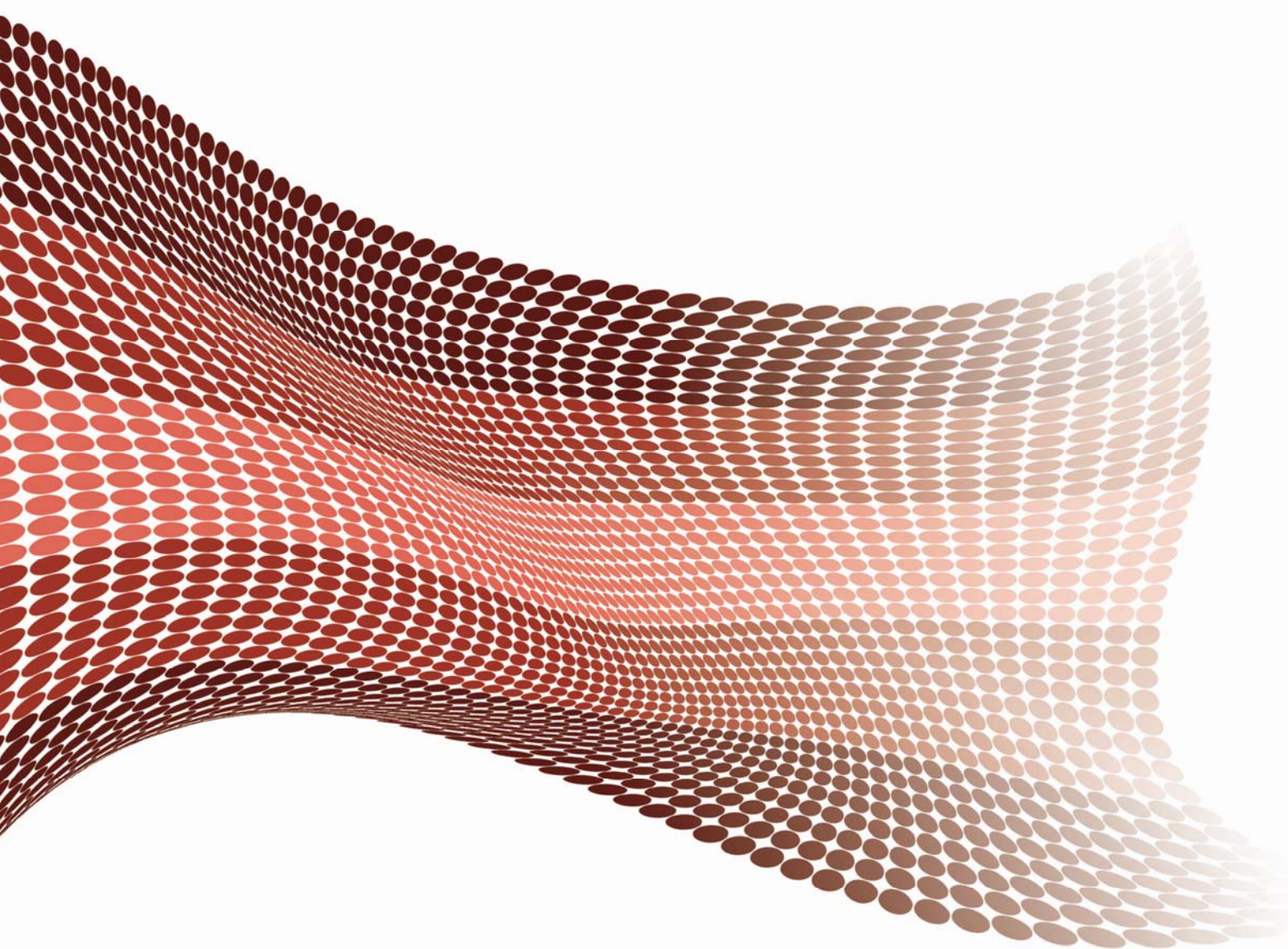

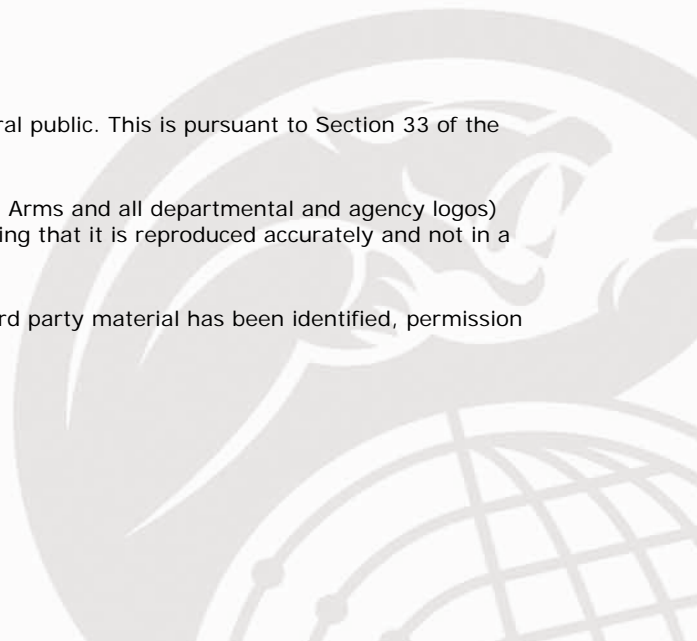

Aim of the Document

This report has been primarily provided to inform the National Referral Mechanism Oversight Board of the UK's delivery against a number of definitive requirements contained in the Council of Europe Convention on Action against Trafficking in Human Beings. Reports are produced for each quarter; the previous report (EXT-6435) included statistics from July to September 2012 and was published in January 2013.

It is important to note that the number of referrals outlined in this report is not a measure of human trafficking in the UK, rather it indicates the number of individuals who have been referred as potential victims of human trafficking.

Report Base

The information in this report is obtained from referrals made to the National Referral Mechanism (NRM) for the three month period from October to December 2012. The data used is correct as at 03/04/2013. It should be noted that the data used is a 'snapshot in time' and there are decisions on trafficking status yet to be made.

The data cut-off date for this report is 03/04/2013.

Key Points

- During the three month period October to December 2012 there were 332 referrals¹ to the NRM comprising individuals from 44 countries of origin, most commonly Albania, Nigeria, Vietnam and Lithuania.
- As at 03/04/2013, 131 of the 332 people referred to the NRM received a 'positive conclusive' decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for people who received a positive conclusive decision were Lithuania, Romania, Slovakia and Philippines.
- 41 of the 332 people referred to the NRM were still awaiting a 'reasonable grounds' decision. 68 of the 332 people referred to the NRM were still awaiting a conclusive decision.
- The most common exploitation type for adults who were referred was sexual exploitation. Labour exploitation was the most common exploitation type for adults who received a positive conclusive decision, and were therefore found to have been trafficked.
- The most common exploitation type for minors who were referred was sexual exploitation. It was also the most common exploitation type for those who received a positive conclusive decision, and were therefore found to have been trafficked.
- One person was referred from Northern Ireland, 37 from Scotland and seven from Wales.

National Referral Mechanism Statistics – July to September 2012

TEXT

1. On 01/04/2009 the UK adopted a National Referral Mechanism (NRM), which is a process to identify individuals who may be potential victims of trafficking (PVoT) and provide them with the protection and support to which they are entitled under the Council of Europe Convention on Action against Trafficking in Human Beings.
2. The process starts when a designated 'first responder'² refers a potential victim of trafficking to one of two separate, but linked, UK Competent Authorities: the UK Border Agency and UK Human Trafficking Centre. The process has two stages, 'Reasonable Grounds'³ and 'Conclusive Decision'⁴, during which trained staff assess all available information in reaching a decision as to whether or not the individual is a victim of human trafficking.
3. This report contains data derived wholly from information supplied by the NRM. The data only reflects potential victims of trafficking referred into the NRM and cannot be taken as a definitive situation report on human trafficking into, within or out of the UK. Potential victims of trafficking may not be referred to the NRM for a number of reasons and therefore would not feature within this report.
4. Details for referrals from first responders for the UK are contained in tables after each summary of adult and minor referrals in the main text. Details for referrals from first responders in Northern Ireland are contained in Annex D; the one referral represents less than 1% of the total UK referrals. Details for referrals from first responders in Scotland are contained in Annex E; the 37 referrals represent 11% of the total UK referrals. Details for referrals from first responders in Wales are contained in Annex F; the seven referrals represent 2% of the total UK referrals.

² The NRM Oversight Board has a prescribed list of organisations that may act as first responder and can refer individuals to the NRM. This list currently contains police officers, SOCA, UK Border Agency, Social Services and a number of non-government organisations (NGOs).

³ The Competent Authorities have a target date of five working days from receipt of referral in which to make a decision. The test that is applied is whether the statement 'I suspect but cannot prove...' would be true and whether a reasonable person would be of the opinion that, having regard to the information available, there were reasonable grounds to believe the individual concerned had been trafficked.

⁴ The Competent Authorities have a target date of 45 calendar days from the Reasonable Grounds decision to make a Conclusive Decision on the individual's victim status having gathered further information. The test that is applied is whether on the balance of probabilities 'It is more likely than not...' that the individual was trafficked based on the information available.

Breakdown of all (Adult and Minor)⁵ Referrals by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

5. During the three month period October to December 2012, there were 332 referrals of adults and minors to the NRM. These referrals comprise individuals from 44 countries of origin. The table below shows the 10 most frequently referred countries of origin, which account for 239 (72%) of all referrals⁶.

6. As at 03/04/2013, the most common countries of origin for people referred were Albania (44), Nigeria (40), Vietnam (34) and Lithuania (30).

7. The most common countries of origin for people who received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process were Lithuania (30), Vietnam (25), Slovakia (23), Albania (21), Nigeria (21) and Romania (21).

8. 131 (39%) of the 332 people referred to the NRM received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for people who received a positive conclusive decision were Lithuania (29), Romania (21), Slovakia (18) and the Philippines (13).

9. 41 (12%) of the 332 people referred to the NRM had not received a reasonable grounds decision. The most common countries of origin for people who had not received a reasonable grounds decision were Albania (12), Nigeria (6), Vietnam (5) and Ghana (3).

10. 69 (21%) of the 332 people referred to the NRM had not received a conclusive decision. The most common countries of origin for people who had not received a conclusive decision were Vietnam (16), Nigeria (12), Albania (11), China (3) and Uganda (3).

Breakdown of Adults by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

11. There were 243 adult referrals, comprising individuals from 40 countries of origin. The table below shows the 10 most referred countries of origin, which account for 176 (72%) of all adult referrals⁷.

12. The most common countries of origin for adults referred were Albania (33), Lithuania (29), Nigeria (26) and Slovakia (21).

13. 176 (72%) of the 243 adult referrals received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process. The most common countries of origin were Lithuania (29), Slovakia (19), Albania (17) and Romania (16).

14. 109 (45%) of the 243 adult referrals received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The most common countries of origin for adults who obtained a positive conclusive decision were Lithuania (28), Romania (16), Slovakia (16) and the Philippines (13).

Breakdown of Adult Referrals by Exploitation Type and Gender, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

15. The most common exploitation types for the 243 adults who were referred were sexual exploitation (103), labour exploitation (95) and domestic servitude (37). Of these, 152 (63%) were females and 91 (37%) were males.

16. Labour exploitation was the most common exploitation type for adults who received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process, as well as those who received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked.

Breakdown of Adult Referrals by Age Range, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

17. Of the 243 adults referred, the largest age group represented were 21-30 year olds who comprised 117 (48%) of those referred. This age group was also the most prevalent for people who received a positive conclusive decision (43).

Breakdown of Minors by Country of Origin, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

18. 89 minors were referred to the NRM, comprising individuals from 22 countries of origin. The table below shows the 10 most frequently referred countries of origin, which account for 74 (83%) of all child referrals⁹.

19. The most common countries of origin for referred minors were Vietnam (22), Nigeria (14), Albania (11), Romania (5) and UK (5).

20. 59 (66%) of the 89 minor referrals received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process. The most common countries of origin were Vietnam (17), Nigeria (8), Romania (5) and the UK (5).

21. 22 (25%) of the 89 minors referred to the NRM received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked. The countries of origin for minors who obtained a positive conclusive decision were Romania (5), the UK (5), Nigeria (2) and Slovakia (2).

Breakdown of Minor Referrals by Exploitation Type and Gender, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

22. The exploitation types for the 89 minors who were referred were unknown exploitation¹⁰ (26), labour exploitation (26), sexual exploitation (26), and domestic servitude (10). Of these, 47 (53%) were females and 42 (47%) were males.

23. The most common exploitation type for minors who received a positive reasonable grounds decision and were therefore submitted to the conclusive grounds process was sexual exploitation.

24. The most common exploitation type for minors who received a positive conclusive decision and were therefore found to have been trafficked was sexual exploitation, accounting for 13 (59%) of the 22 minors receiving a positive conclusive decision.

Breakdown of Minor Referrals by Exploitation Type and Age Range, by Reasonable Grounds (RG) Decision and Conclusive Decision (CD)

25. The age range of 16-17 years old was the most common for minors at the time of referral which comprised 29 (33%) of all referred minors. The age range 16-17 years was also the most common for minors granted a positive conclusive decision and comprised 13 minors.
